Sample Eastern Star Withdrawal Letter

Dear friends of this Eastern Star Chapter,

I had been aware of the OES all my life, but was never a member until someone invited me to join. The organization looked harmless enough, supposedly based on the Bible using five star points as the center of the chapter. These five star points were supposed to be heroines of the Bible. We are warned not to change one word written in the Bible, not to add to nor detract from it. This is an addition.

The first heroine is named Adah, who is supposed to be the daughter of Jephthah (Judges 10:6, 12:7 and 11:30); however Jephthah's daughter is unnamed in the account of Jephthah.
